Local Churches Unite for a Week of Service in Windsor, North Carolina By Paul Shaffer, Glen Burnie UMC VIM Representative

In a heartwarming display of community spirit, 15 dedicated members from local churches recently banded together from October 7th to 14th to serve on the Linthicum Heights and Friends Volunteer in Mission (VIM) team in Windsor, North Carolina. This benevolent collaboration with the Carolina Rebuilding Ministry (CRM) seeks to transform lives by preserving, creating, and sustaining affordable homeownership for low-income families in the historic Albemarle region of northeastern North Carolina.

At the core of CRM's mission is a compelling vision: "A safe and healthy home for every person." In the pursuit of this noble goal, the focus of this year's VIM mission was not centered on hurricane or storm damage, although some residual storm damage may have been encountered along the way.

The VIM team was divided into two sub-teams, each comprised of volunteers with varying skills, and they diligently worked on two homes in the Windsor community. Their projects encompassed the installation of floating laminated flooring in the laundry and bathroom areas, the removal and replacement of wall and door trim, and a fresh coat of paint to rejuvenate the homes.

In the spirit of spiritual renewal, the VIM teams engaged in evening devotions that served to recharge their spiritual batteries for the challenges of each new day. These devotional sessions were not only a highlight of their Christian mission but also a vital presence throughout their journey. Volunteers took turns leading and coordinating these evening devotions, sharing ideas and materials suitable for short devotionals lasting less than ten minutes. The evenings also featured the sharing of "God-sightings," meaningful experiences from the day's work, as well as the uplifting sounds of guitarists and musicians.

The objective was to keep the devotions concise, typically lasting around an hour, encompassing lessons, prayers, devotionals, music, and shared experiences. It was a chance for the team to come together, strengthen their bonds, and find inspiration in their collective faith.

Looking ahead, the 2024 VIM mission to Windsor, North Carolina, is scheduled for October 5th to 12th, 2024. Those interested in joining are encouraged to be prepared for a rewarding and inspiring experience, where they can let God's grace work through them as they serve the community and forge lasting connections with their fellow team members. impressive demonstration of unity and compassion unfolded on September 16th. More than seventy-five individuals of all ages, including the spirited cheerleaders from Old Mill JV, came together to prepare a remarkable 10,154 meals in less than two hours. These meals, comprising of rice, vitamins, and soy, were carefully packaged, weighed, sealed, and boxed, ready for delivery to families in Zimbabwe. Remarkably, each meal is designed to feed a family of four and requires nothing more than water for preparation. What's even more astonishing is that, in the United States and globally, the cost of providing these 10,154 meals was only \$4,000, equating to less than forty cents per meal.

This extraordinary feat holds particular significance considering the challenges of inflation faced both in the United States and worldwide. It reflects the enduring commitment to the biblical principle encapsulated in Matthew 25:35 CEV: "When I was hungry, you gave me something to eat, and when I was thirsty, you gave me something to drink. When I was a stranger, you welcomed me."

The efforts of Deaconess Chlar Evangelista and the entire Glen Burnie United Methodist Church community, along with their compassionate friends and supporters, remind us of the profound impact that collective action can have in combating hunger and fostering a world where no one goes to bed hungry.

GLEN BURNIE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND

In 1992, Glen Burnie UMC established a Permanent Endowment Fund (PEF) to support projects and needs beyond the normal budget. Its purpose is to provide a lasting source of income for church initiatives not covered by the Church's annual operating budget. It allows members and friends to **make charitable gifts for the church's long-term support.** The fund serves various church and community purposes, with funds from an "Outreach" that can be designated for specific categories, such as missions, education, scholarships, worship, capital projects, and more.

Here's how it works: 90% of the net income realized each year goes directly to the "OUTREACH Subaccount," which fuels vital ministries and addresses needs made through grants submitted and approved by the PEF Committee. Thus, your gift touches lives and creates change.

But that's not all - 10% of yearly net income is reinvested back into the fund itself, ensuring we have the resources to do even more good. Your support is a commitment to sustainable giving.

The (PEF) Committee is now accepting grant applications for 2024. Here are a few examples of grants issued in recent years:

- In 2020, a grant of \$13,937.50 was allocated to upgrade the sound system. The existing sound system, originally designed solely for voice, was replaced with a new system that could handle both voice and music. This upgraded system integrated advanced technology, making it more user-friendly.
- In 2023, the Glen Burnie UMC Scholarship Committee requested a \$2,069 grant, which was subsequently approved by the PEF. This grant would match funds raised through a Mother's Day/Father's Day Fundraising Campaign, supporting Glen Burnie Youth in their pursuit of higher education as part of the campaign.
- In 2022, the music ministry director submitted a grant request for \$3,000, which was granted to support the music and professional musicians' performances during the Easter and Christmas Cantatas.
- In 2023, the Missions Committee submitted a request for a \$1,200 grant on behalf of the Women's Care Mary's Center, a faith-based organization in Glen Burnie. The center's primary mission is to provide support to local women in need during their pregnancies. Women's Care Mary's Center offers essential services, including free ultrasounds and pregnancy tests to confirm pregnancy viability. Additionally, they supply crucial items such as clothing, diapers, and pack-n-plays to individuals experiencing pregnancy crises, all made possible through the generous contributions of benefactors.


• In 2020, the trustees requested a \$70,000 grant which was granted to enable the PEF to act as collateral for a Church loan aimed at funding necessary repairs to the church building.






