A Dip in the Ocean

It was a hot August day in 1981 and I was standing neck high in the water at Ocean City. I was body surfing along with three young women. I was having fun until all of a sudden some kind of fish hit me in my right side. I quickly remembered what my dad, who served in the U.S. Coast Guard in Cape May, New Jersey, told me about the ocean. "Ken," he said, "You don't know what is in that water." I was frightened, but I didn't want to appear so in front of the young women.

All that I could think of after getting bumped was this ocean is deep, dark and deadly. I can't even swim that well. What a stupid thing to be doing, just to impress a few young women. Yet, my faith in God kept me from drowning in fear. I prayed there in the water and I felt God's peace flood my heart. I shared with the women what had happened and we moved to waist high water and kept body surfing for another fifteen minutes.

Deep dark and deadly. That's what many people think of the ocean, which is why so many scary movies are set there. The granddaddy of them all: *Jaws*. The tagline for *Jaws* says it all: "You'll never go in the water again."

The term for fear of the ocean is *thalassophobia*." It comes from the Greek: *thalasso*, "sea," and *phobia*, "fear." Fear of the sea is not irrational, but rather primal, according to marine researchers. Just last year, according to *The Washington Post*, "a dorsal fin popped up at Navarre Beach near Pensacola, Fla., prompting a chaotic scramble amid screams of, 'Get out of the water!'"

In the sixth chapter of John's Gospel verses 16-21 the disciples go down to the Sea of Galilee, get into a boat, and start rowing across the sea to Capernaum. Figuring that Jesus wants some time to himself, they head across the water without him. The sky becomes dark, a strong wind begins to blow, and the sea becomes rough, making their progress difficult.

After rowing 3 or 4 miles, they see Jesus walking on the sea and coming near. The whole situation terrifies them: Not only the wind and the waves, but the sight of Jesus walking on the water. Then, he says to them, "It is I; do not be afraid" (v. 20). As they are about to take him in, the boat reaches the land. Immediately, the crisis is averted.

"It is I; do not be afraid." In our most terrifying times, when the sky is dark and the sea is deep, we do not have to fall victim to *thalassophobia*. Jesus is with us, offering us peace in the middle of the watery chaos. When you are feeling frightened by the storms in your own life — financial, medical, relational — and terrified of drowning in raging waters, do not be afraid. *Jesus offers you peace*.

Jesus appears when you are overwhelmed by *thalassophobia* and gives you his peace. Yes, storms will still arise, and water will come up to your neck. But with Jesus by your side, you do not need to be afraid of being overwhelmed.

A dip in the ocean? No thanks. I will never go into the ocean at neck level again. I am thankful for dry land and the wisdom to know the difference between feet and fins. Enjoy your next ocean vacation and be at peace.

WHY WE'RE RISING AGAINST HUNGER


The Glen Burnie United Methodist Missions Committee is seeking 60 to 80 volunteers for our Rise Against Hunger Meal Packaging event on Saturday, August 24, 2024, from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. The need for food among children worldwide is immense, and **Rise Against Hunger** has asked us to increase our meal packaging goal from 10,154 to 14,256 meals. This increase will allow us to feed an additional 20 children for an entire school year. To achieve this, we need to raise \$\$5,900.

Remember, a donation of \$10 provides 30 meals, \$25 provides 75 meals, \$50 provides 147 meals, \$75 provides 220 meals, and \$150 provides 440 meals.

One in three people worldwide is adversely affected by vitamin and mineral deficiencies. The meals we will package on Saturday, August 24th will provide a comprehensive array of micronutrients. In 2023, we packaged 10,154 meals that were sent to Africa. Let's continue making a difference for hungry children in 2024.




In 1992, Glen Burnie UMC established a Permanent Endowment Fund (PEF) to support projects and needs beyond the normal budget. Its purpose is to provide a lasting source of income for church initiatives not covered by the Church's annual operating budget. It allows members and friends to make charitable gifts for the church's long-term support. The fund serves various church and community purposes, with funds from an "Outreach" that can be designated for specific categories, such as missions, education, scholarships, worship, capital projects, and more.

How to turn age 70 & 1/2 into Generosity

If you are age 70 &1/2 and have an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you must begin to withdraw a Required Minimum Distribution amount each year and pay Federal Taxes on it. There is a way for you to contribute some of this money to a Qualified Endowment (like the Glen Burnie UMC Permanent Endowment Fund) and not have it taxed as income. The only requirement is that the funds must go directly from the IRA account to the Permanent Endowment Fund.
